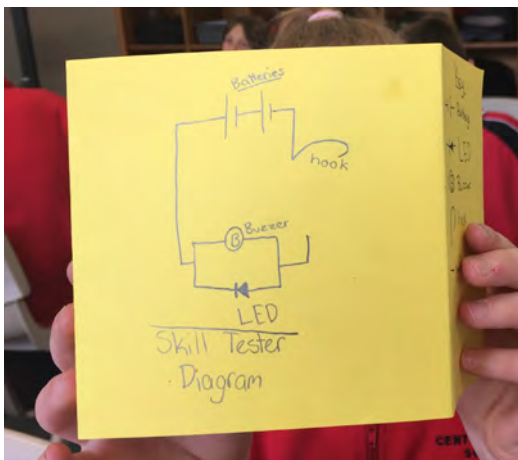
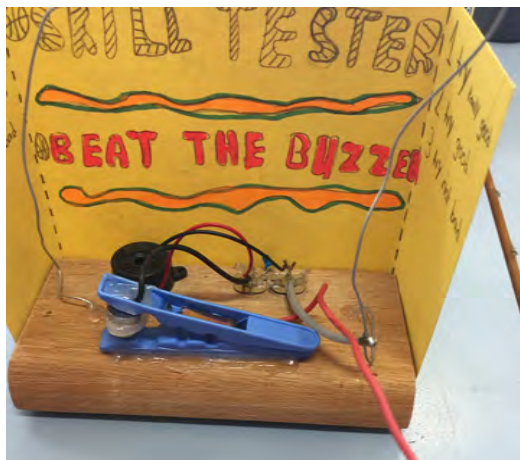
SKILL TESTERS

The Year 6 students used both science and technology skills to construct, test and play their electronic 'Skill Testers'.

Students cut and sanded wooden blocks for a base, soldered wire for the track then connected a buzzer and LED in a simple parallel circuit to complete a game where competitors have to manoeuvre a metal loop

along a conductive wire in the quickest time, with each mistake registering both visually and aurally.

Students developed problem-solving skills (especially regarding connectivity issues!), used creativity in adapting clothes pegs to

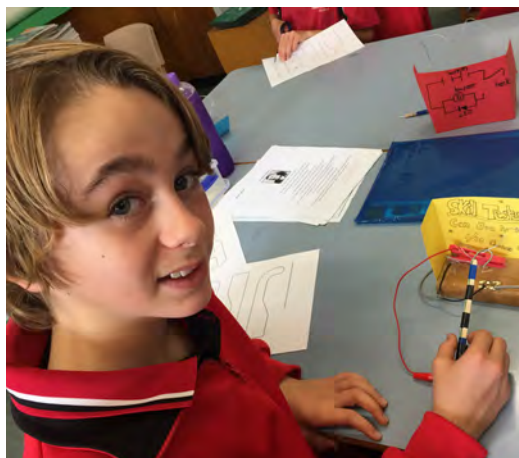




create battery holders and learned about LED polarity and why it's important in electronic circuits.

Resilience and perseverance were also found useful by students who applied too much hot glue to their projects! The games were finished with a backdrop explaining the game and a circuit diagram of the components involved and the class showed off their finished skill testers at a recent Primary Assembly

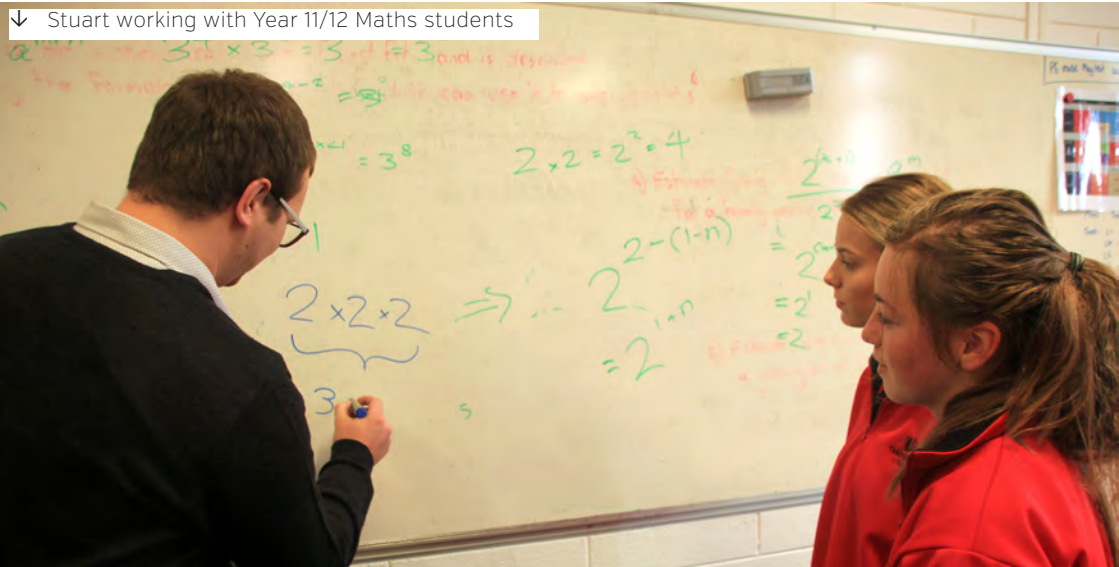
