Welcome to the 2019 school year!


efore I start my article

Student News

I would particularly like to welcome students, and their families, who are new to Central Yorke School.

It was with great excitement we started the first day with 203 students R-12 and 264 students across all three sites. Our kindy is nearing capacity and will soon look to becoming a full time Early Learning Centre.

Walking the halls of the school, every classroom once again has a class in it working hard. Our staff have a renewed enthusiasm and there is a feel around the school of excitement and vigour.

My main aim this year is to continue to work with the community to ensure Central Yorke School is a place that all the community is proud of, and that enables all students to develop the necessary skills, attitudes and

competencies that allows them to become positive, productive members of our community.

As a B-12 school with a rich culture, we are still developing and amending procedures. Your feedback in this process is crucial, so please do not hesitate to contact the school if you have any concerns or ideas that can improve what we do. We are all in this together.

Appropriate behaviour

Harassment, physical violence, disrupting others learning, any form of substance abuse cannot be tolerated in a school setting. Teachers and students have a right to learn together to make a difference in a safe supportive environment.

Appearances, including the ways the grounds, buildings and classrooms are cared for. There seems to be an absence of graffiti and rubbish in our surrounds and the school certainly looks great. It is something I have acknowledged and expect to continue.



Students wearing **uniform** is very important, it sets work apart from the weekend or after school activity. We believe it helps to build identity and pride; it is a discipline that I think helps create a better learning environment.

Punctuality/Attendance

All students need to be at school and to their lessons on time, continual lateness and/or non-attendance has a dramatic effect on a students' learning. Support from parents here is critical especially in the years where students are reliant on parents to make this happen.

Bullying/Harassment

My belief here is that all children and staff have the right to come to school, to learn or teach in a harassment free environment. CYS nut awareness policy

With the start of the new year comes new challenges in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff. In view of this we would like to draw families' attention to the CYS NUT AWARENESS GUIDELINES for R-12.

NUT AWARENESS GUIDELINES R-12

CONTEXT

DECD schools are required to promote and develop learning environments that are safe and supportive. Students and staff may have anaphylactic (severe allergic) conditions that include nut allergies. This means that exposure at school may constitute a risk to their health and wellbeing.

While it is not possible to guarantee that the school environment will be completely free of potential nut hazards, risks can be minimised by adhering within reasonable guidelines.

PURPOSE

- To raise the awareness of anaphylactic conditions for all members of the school community
- To provide a safe school environment for all members of the school community

PARENTS

- Are requested not to send foods along to school with their children that contain nuts. This includes products such as 'Nutella', Peanut Paste, all types of nuts, peanut cooking oil and other foods such as Muesli bars that may contain nuts
- Will be informed of Central Yorke School's Nut Awareness Guidelines at the commencement of each school year and reminders via the Newsletter and social media
- Will provide the school with a Health Care Plan if their child has a serious allergy to nuts

STUDENTS

- Are advised not to share food from home
- Are encouraged to wash hands before and after eating

STAFF

- Will be made aware of students and colleagues who have anaphylactic responses to nut allergies
- Will supervise students during lunch eating time and be vigilant with regards to these guidelines
- Will participate in First Aid training to understand responses and procedures related to Anaphylaxis
- Will ensure that food provided through the Canteen, Breakfast Club, for Fundraising purposes, on camps and within lessons, such as Home Ec, does not contain nuts

PROMOTION

- These guidelines will be shared with the Governing Council and Parents and Friends group
- Information will be distributed via the school newsletter and social media
- Staff will be informed annually at the start of the school year and as part of the induction process for new staff
- New families to the school community will be informed via a copy of the guidelines in the enrolment package.

The school acknowledges that due to current food processing practices, it is impractical to eliminate nuts and nut products entirely from an environment where there is food. The emphasis is therefore on raising awareness and adopting the reasonable procedures termed as "Nut Awareness".






