
Term 1 Swimming 2016

Year 5/6 Science

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
The Year 5/6 class are investigating light in their first Science unit for the year. The topic is part of the Physical Sciences strand of the Year 5 'Science Understandings' and by its completion students will be able to explain and demonstrate how 'Light from a source forms shadows and can be absorbed, reflected and refracted.' They'll also be posing questions, choosing variables to change and measure in experiments and compare data with predictions.

The 'Engage and Explore' phase of our unit centred on the question 'how can you demonstrate that light moves in a straight line?' The students discovered a number of ways to set up their equipment and complete the task.

In further activities they'll investigate reflection and refraction of light and construct periscopes and microscopes.
