CERTIFICATE II IN CONSTRUCTION PATHWAYS

This course gives a taste of different trades in the building industry. Students develop a broad range of skills across joinery, shopfitting, carpentry and bricklaying and learn foundational skills that will help them gain trade apprenticeships.

Through theoretical and practical course work, students will learn to read and interpret specifications and plans, carry out measurements and calculations, correctly use hand and power tools, identify materials they will work with in construction and learn how to follow instruction from trade supervisors.

WHAT IS THE PREMIER'S ANZAC SPIRIT SCHOOL PRIZE?

The South Australian Premier's ANZAC Spirit School Prize is an educational initiative designed to commemorate and honour the ANZAC spirit, which represents the qualities of courage, mateship, perseverance, and sacrifice demonstrated by the ANZACs in the First World War. Key aspects of the prize include:

Student Participation: The prize is open to South Australian students, typically from Years 9 and 10. It encourages them to actively engage in learning and reflect upon the history, significance, and enduring impact of the ANZACs.

Research and Presentation: Students are required to research a specific aspect of Australia's involvement in the First World War or another significant military engagement. This research often involves creating a presentation or a written piece that demonstrates their understanding and insights into the ANZAC spirit.

Awards and Recognition: Winners of the prize are recognized for their outstanding work..

Educational Impact: The initiative aims to educate younger generations about the sacrifices and contributions of the ANZACs.

Community Involvement: The prize often involves collaboration with local communities, veterans' organizations, and educational bodies. .

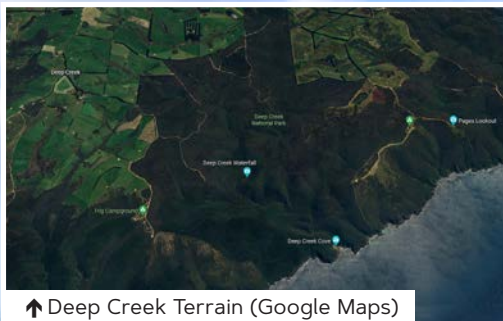
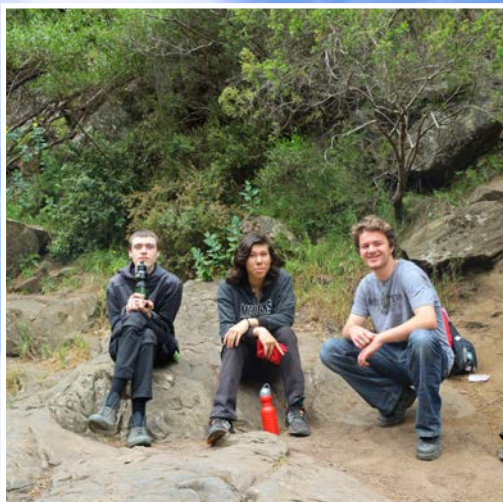
Deep Creek Hike

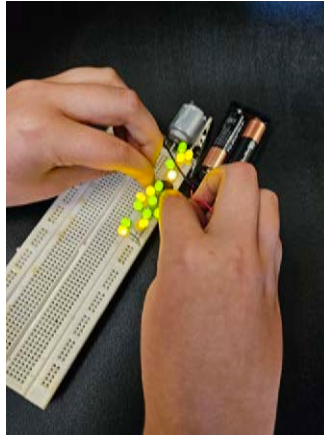


R-1 STEM

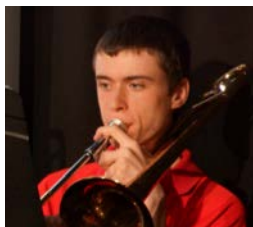

The 7/8 Rock Band performed a set of songs in between the two socials and it was great to hear some live music.

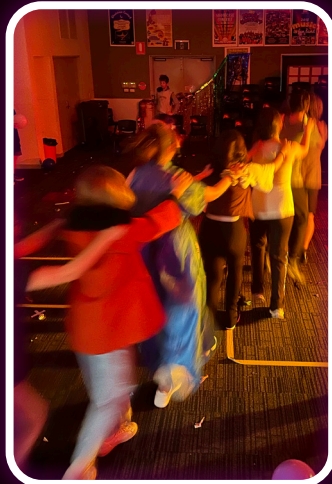


SECONDARY SOCIAL

LOCAL EMERGENCY SERVICES



This term, the JP classes have been learning about our local emergency services. We've all memorized the number to call for help (000) and re-enacted many mock emergency calls to the help centre, requesting assistance from either fire, police, ambulance, or coastal patrol services. Students have learned to calmly call for help, clearly state their name, location, and to stay on the line until help arrives.

FIRE SAFETY

Initially, we focused on fire safety and learned important drills. We discussed how to safely evacuate a smoke-filled room by remembering the phrase 'get down low and go, go, go.' Students practiced feeling doors for heat and crawling to safety. We also learned what to do if embers or sparks land on us, revisiting the mantra 'stop, drop, cover, and roll', which we practiced together down the corridor.

COASTAL PATROL VISIT

On November 1 we had the privilege of hosting the Royal Volunteer Coastal Patrol at our school. A big thank you to volunteers Graham, Diane, Jarred, and

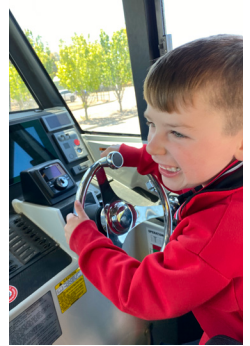

The group showcased some of the state-of-the-art equipment on their boat, including four radios for communication with marine vessels, police, and the call centre; heat-activated night vision camera, safety buoys, EPIRBs and flares. The students eagerly asked questions, learned how to properly wear a Personal Flotation Device (PFD), and explored the boat, with the cabin being a particular highlight.

AMBULANCE VISIT

On November 15, we were fortunate to have Julie and Dawn bring an ambulance to our school. The students thoroughly enjoyed exploring the ambulance, examining the medical supplies, being strapped to the stretcher, sitting in the driver's seat, and being wheeled around in the wheelchair.

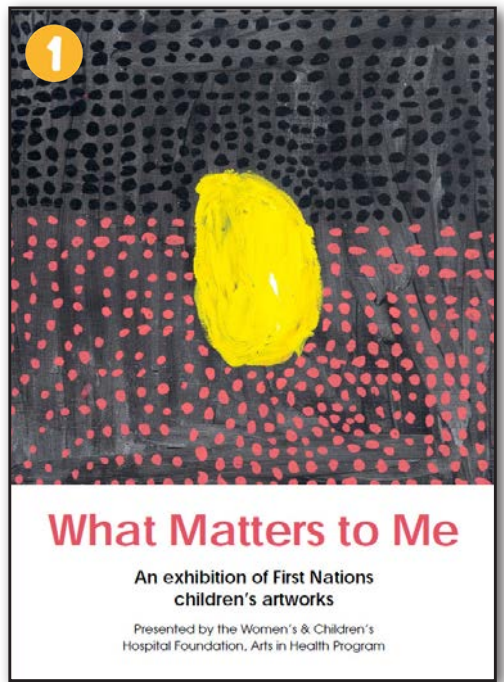


What Matters To Me

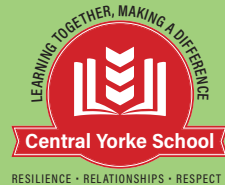

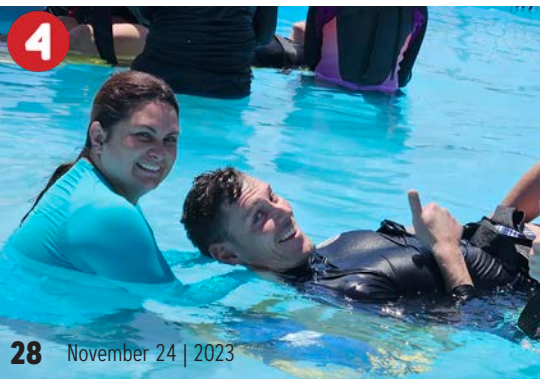

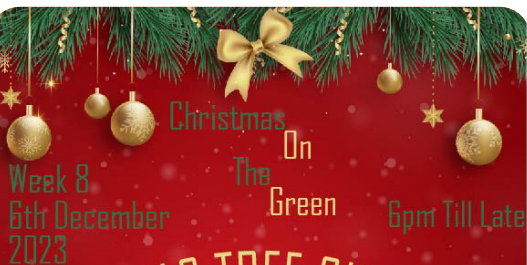
