## **Remembrance Day**

riginally called Armistice Day, this day commemorated the end of the hostilities for the Great War (World War I), the signing of the armistice, which occurred on 11 November 1918 – the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Armistice Day was observed by the Allies as a way of remembering those who died, especially soldiers with 'no known grave'. This year was celebrating 100 years since the signing of the armistice

At Central Yorke School we observed one minute's silence at 11.00 am to remember the sacrifice of those who died or otherwise suffered in Australia's cause in wars and war-like conflicts. Our School was also represented at a special service at the War Memorial.

Our ceremony, which was organised by Miss Bubner and Miss Smith and hosted by their year 10 History Class and the 4/5's, was also attended by representatives from the RSL and Vietnam Veterans Association.





The assembly was a very moving one with our students researching local nurses and veterans. The veterans included families here from Maitland and Point Pearce and was a reminder to us all the sacrifices our community made in times of war. The assembly also included virtual tours of the battle grounds, readings of poems and a very special last post performed by some of our students.

## **Pupil free day**



Their next activity involved designing an experiment to determine the impact of exercise on heart rate and to answer the question 'Does what a person is wearing during exercise effect their heartrate?'


Again the boys enlisted the help of their classmates to test their theories and used the school heart rate monitors linked up to ipads to collect data. Aside






