POINT PEARCE ELC VISIT

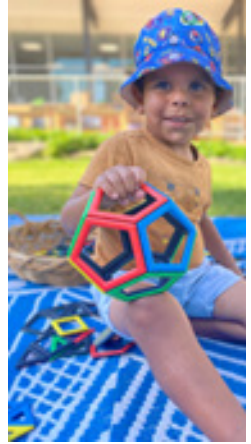
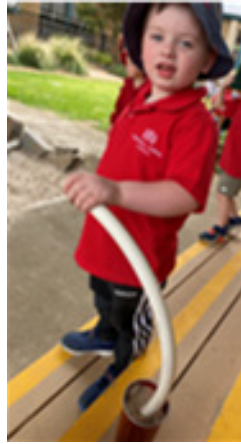

Improving support for children with autism

The Department for Education in South Australia has introduced a range of improved support services in 2023, including:

- Appointing an Autism Inclusion Teacher in every primary school
- increasing the number of staff in preschools with qualifications in autism
- Exploring opportunities to offer more early childhood intervention services in children's centres
- Supporting schools to sign up to the Autism Friendly Charter
- Providing more specialist staff in schools.

AUTISM INCLUSION TEACHERS

An Autism Inclusion Teacher will be appointed in every public primary school from 2023. The Autism Inclusion Teacher will:

- Provide support to their fellow educators on how to best support and educate students with autism
- Drive improved practice relating to autism that works for their school.

The department will monitor the outcomes of the Autism Inclusion Teacher initiative to inform any future expansion of the role, including for high schools.

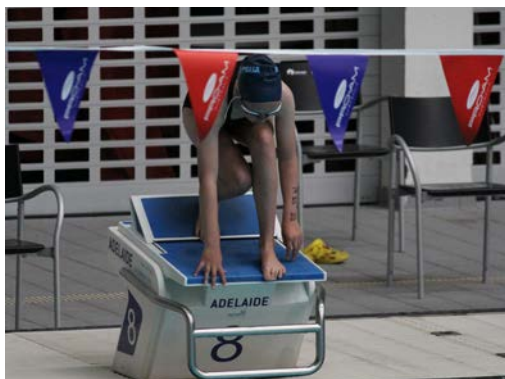

NATIVE TITLE DETERMINATION

It was a very proud day for the Point Pearce Aboriginal Campus to be part of the Consent Determination Federal Court Hearing acknowledging Narungga peoples Native Title Rights over the Yorke Peninsula.

Native Title Holder Recognition

After a decade-long wait, South Australia's Narungga people have been recognised as Native Title holders of the Yorke Peninsula.

The Federal Court of Australia determination formally acknowledges Narungga peoples' Native Title rights and interests in land and waters from Mundoorra in the north to Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park in the south of the Yorke Peninsula.

The ruling also saw Narungga people compensated with a settlement for the unlawful loss of their connection to Country in areas where native title was extinguished.

Narungga Nation Aboriginal Corporation chair Anne Newchurch said although the compensation will "never be enough", the decision creates an opportunity for Narungga people to invest in future generations.

"This is a historical and emotional day for the Narungga people and community who have continued the journey of our Elders started over 20 years ago," Ms Newchurch said.

"The compensation will never be enough for the loss of our cultural heritage and our people's connection to Country, but it does provide our people with an opportunity to invest in our future and to provide opportunities for our children, and our children's children."

Narungga people met at Point Pearce Aboriginal Campus to see their Native Title rights recognised.

Native Title applicant and proud Narungga man John Bucksin said the determination recognised the fight fought by many previous Narungga generations, whilst providing a pathway for future economic prosperity.

Positive Primers

Each newsletter we will be highlighting one of the BSEM strategies being implemented across our site. This time we are looking at Positive Primers.

When people experience positive emotions, their minds broaden and they open up to new possibilities and ideas. At the same time, positive emotions help people build their personal well-being resources, ranging from physical resources, to intellectual resources, and social resources (Fredrickson 2009).

Berry Street uses positive primers at the beginning of a day (or lesson) to encourage the flow of positive emotions. Well used positive primers include saying the class roll in a funny voice, using a funny YouTube clip, or using images of nature or everyday objects.

PICTURES OF NATURE

There is a lot of evidence to suggest that even just looking at pictures of nature can activate the parasympathetic nervous system and lower stress levels (van den Berg et al., 2015).

By using closeup photos we can stimulate curiosity and positive emotions.



What is that? That looks interesting! Can you work out what the three images above are? Too easy? (A cross section of a carrot, a leaf from a peace lily and some wet mulch).

A good lead in for a science lesson?

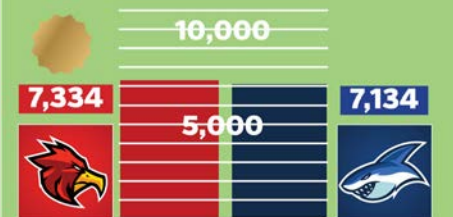

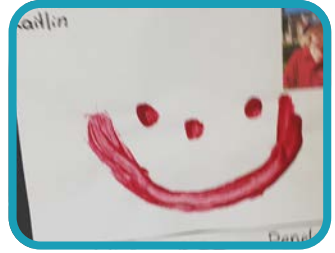
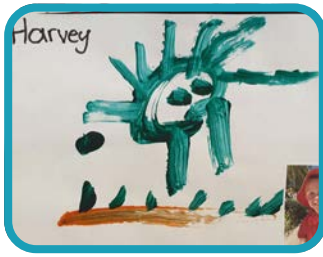
